From the Editor

Well, I said I'd be gone last time, but in the absence of any takers I've agreed to stay on for two more editions. The Christmas edition will be my last and unless something changes it will also sadly mark the closure of the Newsletter.

The summer has seen one of the driest on record - one local gent told me that the last time the river was dry back to the ford was in 1976. The lack of water necessitated a number of rescue missions from the Environment Agency team and our cover shows Dave and Laura in the stretch of river bisecting our garden. This was on Sunday 17th August. On this occasion they evacuated 93 fish which were put into a tank and taken upstream for release at Honeyhole. That was 93 fish just from our two neighbours and our stretch of the river. When I spoke to Dave his estimate was that between 500 and



600 fish were transported during the prolonged dry spell from Bucknell alone. I was stunned at the rate at which the river level dropped. I noted almost a foot drop in water level overnight. September has certain refreshed the river and I am wondering how long it will be until we see fish again. The sunny weather has certainly produced an excellent variety of butterflies and moths in the garden this year.

In this edition it is good to see recognition for some unsung heroes, Derek and Silvia (page 27), who have been recognised for their work on the poppy appeal locally. I was also pleased to share the activities of the children from the school (page 7). We also learn about changes to the rail timetable and what is happening at Mortimer Medical Practice.



Mortimer Medical Practice - Total Triage

With the Governments vision for October 2025, a new system called Total Triage will be coming into operation 1st October 2025. This will be an online service which hopefully will help the 8.30am telephone rush for appointments.

Patients will be asked to complete an online form with questions about their symptoms/ problems this will then be Triaged by the GP in the surgery and patients will be offered either a same day appointment, an appointment for another day, a telephone conversation, a prescription left at dispensary to be picked up or an appointment to see either a Practice Nurse, Nurse Practitioner, Physician Associate, or advice to attend a Minor Injuries Department or Accident and Emergency Department. The Practice Manager wanted to reassure patients that staff would be there to help. There will be further information published in the Practice Newletters, the practice website and those who have access, the Practice Facebook page.

Dispensary - The staff are really up against a challenging time with around 97 hrs a week lost through sickness/maternity /annual leave. They have not yet been able to recruit into the gaps. There has been an increase in abusive and aggressive behaviour towards the staff which has been upsetting and not acceptable. They ask patients please to be respectful and mindful of the challenges they are facing and they are doing their best to keep up.

There is still an opportunity for a Bucknell rep.

Flood Group - Update

As you may expect there has been little activity in respect of flooding but we are still dealing with the impact of the October 2024 flood. The Environment Agency PFR (Property Flood Resilience) scheme has begun to be rolled out.

This is funding which is administered by the Environment Agency. Property Flood Resilience refers to measures and practices that reduce the impact of flooding on buildings and their occupants. These measures are essential in areas prone to flooding and can work alongside traditional engineered flood defences and Nature-based Solutions. PFR can help minimise flood damage, lower repair costs, reduce the recovery and reoccupation time and increase the safety of occupants during and after a flood event.

Surveys have begun to take place in early September to some of the affected properties in Bucknell. We hope to see some measures put in place before the end of the current financial year. Our next Multi-Agency-Meeting is due to take place in October.

5th TRAIN FROM BUCKNELL REINSTATED FROM 15th DECEMBER 2025

You will recall that in December 2024 our train service was reduced to 4 through trains a day (plus an early morning train from Llandrindod to Shrewsbury. Earlier this year we were promised reinstatement of the 5th through train and this will be happening on 15th December 2025. Although the first and last trains are largely the same, the trains in the middle of the day are completely recast. The new times Monday - Friday are as follows

Saturday times are similar. Sunday trains still two a day at the current times. The full timetable can be seen on the Real Time Trains website and will be on the TfW website in due course. As an alternative to the train, bus routes 738/740. Run by Minsterley Motors, still run 4 times a day to and from Ludlow and Knighton. Timetables are on bus stops in the village or the Minsterley Motors website. The service 498 to Hereford on Wednesday no longer starts from Bucknell, but can be joined at the Lion in Leintwardine at 9.30am. Whether the X48 bus route that parallels the train from Llandrindod to Craven Arms will change is not known.





News from the Police

County lines

County lines is the name given to drug dealing where organised criminal groups (OCGs) use phone lines to move and supply drugs, usually from cities into smaller towns and rural areas. They exploit vulnerable people, including children and those with mental health or addiction issues, by recruiting them to distribute the drugs, often referred to as 'drug running'. OCGs often use high levels of violence and intimidation to protect the 'county line' and control them.

There are several signs to look out for that may indicate someone is involved in county lines:

- Repeatedly going missing from school or home and being found in other areas
- Having money, new clothes or electronic devices and they can't explain how they paid for them
- Getting high numbers of texts or phone calls, being secretive about who they're speaking to
- Decline in school or work performance
- · Significant changes in emotional or physical well-being


Sextortion Scams

'Sextortion' is a type of online blackmail, it's when criminals gain the trust of individuals in order to obtain sexually explicit material and then use it to coerce victims for the purposes of financial gain. Anyone can be a victim of sextortion, however, young people, particularly males aged between 15 to 17, are often most at risk and it has been a key factor in suicides. Criminals often target people through dating apps, social media, webcams, or pornography sites. If a person you've just met online chats to you in a sexual way, or asks for sexual images, it might be an attempt at sextortion. You should be wary if someone you've met online:

- is trying to start a relationship with you very quickly (they may even send you a sexual image first)
- chats to you in a sexual way, or asks for sexual images, soon after you've met them.
- has sent friend requests to lots of people, not just you
- repeatedly asks you to do sexual things that you're not comfortable with
- tells you they've hacked your account or have access to your contacts

Sextortion attempts can happen very quickly, or they can happen over a long time. You should never share sexual images or information about yourself if you are not comfortable. You should stop engaging with the individual if you feel uncomfortable, or if someone contacts you online who you don't know. You can also review your privacy settings, criminals are less likely to target you if they can't see who your friends and family are. We understand that it might be difficult to report this type of crime, however if you are a victim of sextortion, or you are worried you are being targeted, it's never your fault and have done nothing wrong. Stop all communication with the offender immediately, you should also never pay, as there is no guarantee that this will stop the threats.

Chapel Lawn and The Redlake Valley A social history as told by extracts from the Clun Valley Parochial Magazine 1889 to 1899

These extracts from the Clun Valley Parochial Magazine for St. Mary's Church, Chapel Lawn, at the time a chapel of ease to Clun Church, together with some early photographs and pen portraits of the 'movers and shakers' of the time, provide a fascinating glimpse into 19th century rural life in the Redlake Valley on the border of England and Wales. The introduction of the magazine must have been very welcome. It not only provided important information about forthcoming church, school, and other social events, but it also enabled people to read news from neighbouring parishes and the wider world. We must be indebted to the Rev. Charles Warner whose initials are at the end of the introduction to the first issue. It is through his personal efforts, plus encouragement from Rev. Preb. Jellicorse of Clunbury, and through delegation to the various curates who had the good fortune (or bad luck when the weather was inclement) to be attached to Chapel Lawn, that the Magazine was

undertaken, and we have this account of life in a quiet rural community in the late 19th Century. It was with some prescience that in March 1889, Rev. Warner wrote, "The monthly parts will, when bound, make a handsome volume, which will prove most interesting, as a record of parish news for future generations." The discovery of a cache of old parish magazines provided the material and inspiration for this book and, Patrick hopes, will encourage others in neighbouring parishes to use the magazines in a similar way now that they are safely stored at Clun Museum.

BUCKNELL NEW VILLAGE HALL

The team from Liverpool University School of Architecture came down to Bucknell, as arranged, on Saturday 2 August primarily to meet with representatives of existing and prospective user groups of the New Village Hall. This visit was very helpful and provided the University team with useful information as they begin to finalise their proposals for the internal fit-out of the New Hall. Their plans will then be considered later by the Hall Committee. The visit also provided an opportunity to discuss in some detail, the next stages of this project which will include the appointment of technical consultants such as structural engineers, quantity surveyors, heating and electrical engineers etc. The discussion also included the important issue of cost and funding possibilities.

Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO)

Readers of the Magazine will no doubt be aware that the Trustees of the unincorporated Bucknell Memorial Hall and Recreation Ground Charity took the decision to transfer its functions to a new CIO in August 2024. A CIO provides a legal identity to the Charity which will assist as funds are sought to build the new Village Hall. The CIO application was approved by the Charity Commission on 4 July 2025 and took over the functions of the unincorporated Charity on 9 September 2025. The Trustees of the fully operational CIO will meet for the first time in October.
