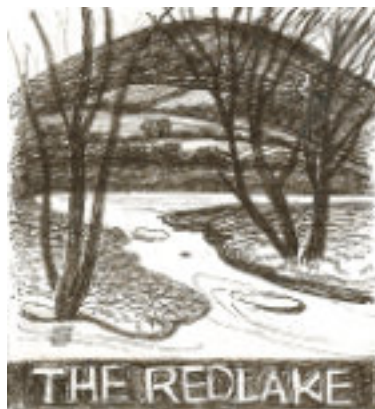

Flood Group - Update

On the positive side, Bucknell doesn't seem to have experienced any serious flooding since the October 2024 episode. However, that does not mean that the Flood Group hasn't been active in that time. Following on from the open meeting at the Memorial Hall in November, the group compiled a dossier of those impacted by flooding and how the flooding affected (and in some cases continues to affect) them. This dossier was presented to the Multi-Agency meeting in December, where members of the Parish Council joined the Flood Group, as well as representatives from The National Flood Forum (NFF), the Environment Agency, Severn Trent, Shropshire Highways and Shropshire Council Flood Risk Manager.

One action on the Flood Group was to work with NFF to develop a Flood Response Plan (FRP), which is a document to be shared only with the Emergency Services. This will aid their responses in understanding what properties might be inaccessible and who might be especially at risk. This is not an open document, but one which is purely to aid any responses from the emergency services. If you think you may be impacted or you know someone who is impacted please get in touch with me. We have since had two further meetings with the NFF on the FRP and hope to have a working document soon.

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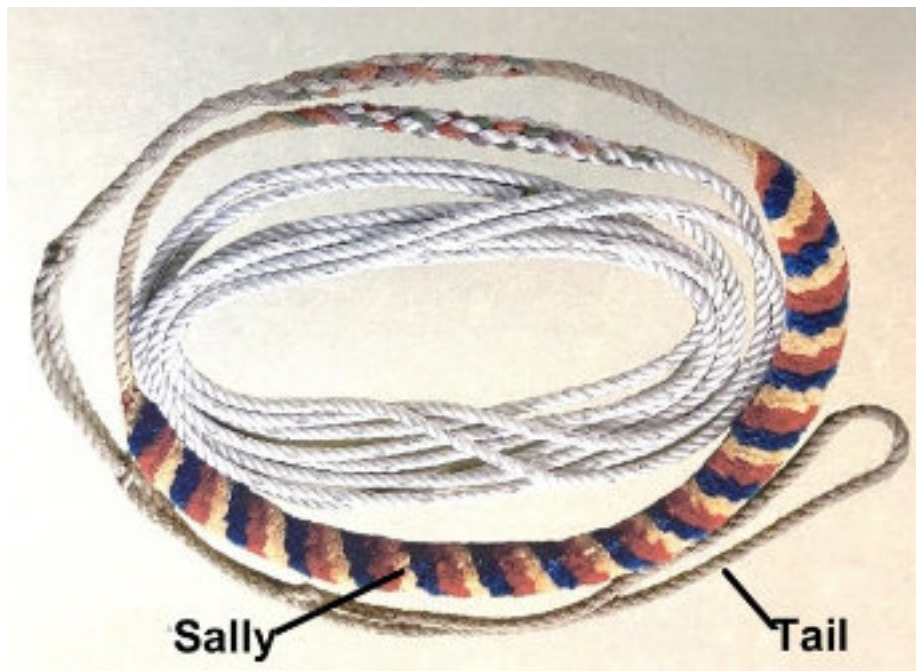
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Ringling in the new Millennium

Our introduction to church bell ringing came in 1999 when we lived in Louth in Lincolnshire. At that time there was a national campaign to recruit more people so that all the church bells in the country could be rung at the stroke of midnight of the new millennium.

Little did we know that we were about to enter a fascinating and rewarding world, having its own language and terminology. A hobby – nay, an obsession that's good for both physical and mental stimulation. It also introduced us to a brand-new family of friends. We were then in our mid 50's and it wasn't hard to learn the basics. There was always a friendly someone there willing to help and encourage us on your journey.



Louth has the tallest parish church steeple in the UK at 293 feet, surpassed only by a handful of cathedrals and so our very first challenge was to climb the 120 steps up a narrow stone spiral staircase to enter the ringing chamber (totally out of breath). The bells too, are quite heavy with the big bell (the tenor) weighing in at a hefty 1½ tons. When all 8 bells are ringing, the tower actually sways!

So, let's get hold of a rope and give it a good tug. Should be easy enough, shouldn't it? Although the activity might appear to the casual observer as straightforward, you will soon find that it takes a little while to get it right. First you get to hold the tail end of the rope and are instructed about the feel of the bell, and after a time it feels less of a challenge. Then it's time to learn about the sally. Your journey now begins.

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News from the Police

Burglaries

December 2024 saw a spike in burglaries, mainly to outbuildings, where power tools and scrap metal has been targeted by the offenders. Many of the locations have been near to the Welsh border including, Bishop's Moat, Heblands, White Grit and Anchor. Other locations have been Bentlawnt, Hemford and Worthen. There have also been two dwelling burglaries at a property in Anchor, Newcastle on Clun. At around 00:30 on the 23rd December, two males have awoken the occupant by their talking, the victim has discovered them in the living area of the large property. On being disturbed the offenders have pushed passed the victim, running out of the property with a large amount of silverware which had been stored in the living room. It is likely the offenders believed the property to be unoccupied due to it looking in need of repair. However, the same property was entered again in the early hours of the 14th January where offenders have jemmied open a fire exit door and made their way onto the first floor and taking more silver crockery. Some of the stolen silverware includes 6 silver teaspoons, 1 silver tablespoon, 4 Persian silver goblets, 4 small goblets, 6 napkin rings, 1 set of silver cutlery, 1 silver server, 1 rose bowl, 2 Persian silver cigarette boxes, 1 oblong tray with 3 small cases, 6 coffee spoons with camels on, 1 silver photo frame and 2 sets of table silver. LIVESTOCK THEFT

During the last month there have been two separate reports of theft of sheep in the area, one near the Kerry Ridgway and the other around Chapel Lawn. There has also been a report of an illegal slaughter of a sheep just over the border into Powys, the sheep was killed and skinned in the field it was grazing in with the offenders just leaving behind its fleece and head. Please be wary of unusual activity around fields containing livestock such as unknown vehicles seen parked in gateways or the sheep making more noise than usual suggesting something is disturbing them. If you own livestock please consider locking gates with padlocks, keep your hedges, fences and gates in good repair and check your livestock regularly. Please report any suspicious activity involving livestock to police.

LIVESTOCK WORRYING

Lambing season is now starting where historically it has coincided with increased reports of livestock being worried or attacked by dogs. Under the Dogs (Protection of Livestock) Act 1953 it is an offence to allow a dog to worry sheep, worrying includes attacking or chasing sheep. Dog Owners, either living locally or simply visiting the area for a walk, have a responsibility to keep their dogs under control at all times. It is vital that dogs are kept on a lead around livestock, even if they can usually be trusted to come to call. If living in or near a farming area, please make sure that the dog is secure and cannot escape from the property.

BUCKNELL NEW VILLAGE HALL

The planning application for a new Village Hall on the Daffodil Lane site was approved by Shropshire Council in October 2024. The permission is valid for three years unless it is extended. Much work has to be done if progress is to be made including work on the detailed design of the building and site utilisation. These issues will be discussed at design meetings with the team from the Liverpool School of Architecture.

The technical design also relates to compliance with Building Regulations and provision of information for potential contractors from which to tender and ultimately build. In order to complete this stage, additional design input will be required from both the architectural team and a range of specialist consultants such as structural engineers.

Without a doubt this is going to be an expensive project with building costs increasing very significantly over recent years. The University team are looking at the feasibility of phasing the construction work and other cost saving measures including the possibility of using some voluntary labour at certain stages.

It has always been the intention to seek funding for this project from a mixture of grants, corporate donations and possibly the public sector. Applications for funding will be made in due course in the name of the CIO (Charitable Incorporated Charity) once this is established and fully operational.

Finally, it is pleasing to note that Liverpool University School of Architecture continue to support our project. The team from the University plan to come down to Bucknell on Saturday 12 April to present their updated work at an Open Day in the Memorial Hall. This will be open to the public as before and will be an opportunity to quiz the team and for the team to take on board comments from the public. Please attend if you can – your views and comments are important.

REVISED TRAIN TIMES AND NEW BUS SERVICE X48

In the last Newsletter I wrote about the reduction of the train service through Bucknell. Since then you may have noticed bus route X48 running through the village. This is intended as a partial replacement for the missing trains. Run by Celtic Travel on behalf of Transport for Wales, the route runs between Llandrindod Wells and Craven Arms and is timed to connect at Craven Arms with trains to and from Shrewsbury. Unfortunately there has been virtually no publicity about the new route apart from a timetable on the Celtic Travel Website and copies I have posted on bus stops and the notice board in the village, consequently most buses are almost empty. I am told that the service is funded until August 2025.

Buses for **Craven Arms leave Bucknell Station at 06.48, 10.48 14.48 and 18.48 and to Llandrindod at 08.07, 12.07, 17.42 and 21.47.** English National Bus Passes can be used across the border to and from Llandrindod and if you have a train ticket it can be used to return on the bus. There is however a glimmer of hope regarding the train service. A report on the Knighton Forum face book page reports that the Welsh Government has agreed to fund the 5th through train on the line. We await further news on this, but the earliest this can be done would be the June timetable change (or possibly December). **Brian Willson**
